We will be exploring a variety of different modes of transport and talking about how we move around. We will also learn about the people who work for the emergency services and explore the vehicles they use.

Some texts and stories we will use include 'The Train Ride' and 'Emma Jane's Aeroplane'.

How can you support your child?

Talk about and describe the vehicles you see when out and about.

Summer 2



'Playtime'

This half term our learning will be around the toys we play with and toys from the past. We will be exploring how toys have changed over the years and learning different facts.

Some texts and stories we will use to support our learning include 'Kipper's Toybox' and 'Lost in the Toy Museum'.

How can you support your child?

Look at toys and books you might have from your childhood and compare them with parents and grandparents.

'Creepy Crawlies'

Spring 2

'Here, There and Everywhere.'

We will be learning about a range of different homes and animal homes through the use of fiction and non-fiction texts. We will talk about the types of homes we live in and where animals choose to make their homes. We will also be exploring different homes from around the world.

Texts and stories we will look at include 'The Gruffalo' and 'Every House in Every Street'.

How can you support your child?

Talk about where animals live and why?

Go for a walk in the woods and look out for animal homes.
